

If you witness individuals attempting to steal anhydrous ammonia do not confront them Leave the area immediately and call 911 to report the theft.

How Can I Reduce Anhydrous Theft?

- Deliver tanks to farms as close to actual time of use as possible.
- Position tanks in the open where they can be seen from the road.
- Return tanks immediately when empty.
- Remove hoses between the tank and tool bar when left in the field unattended.

A security tag program to help reduce anhydrous ammonia theft.

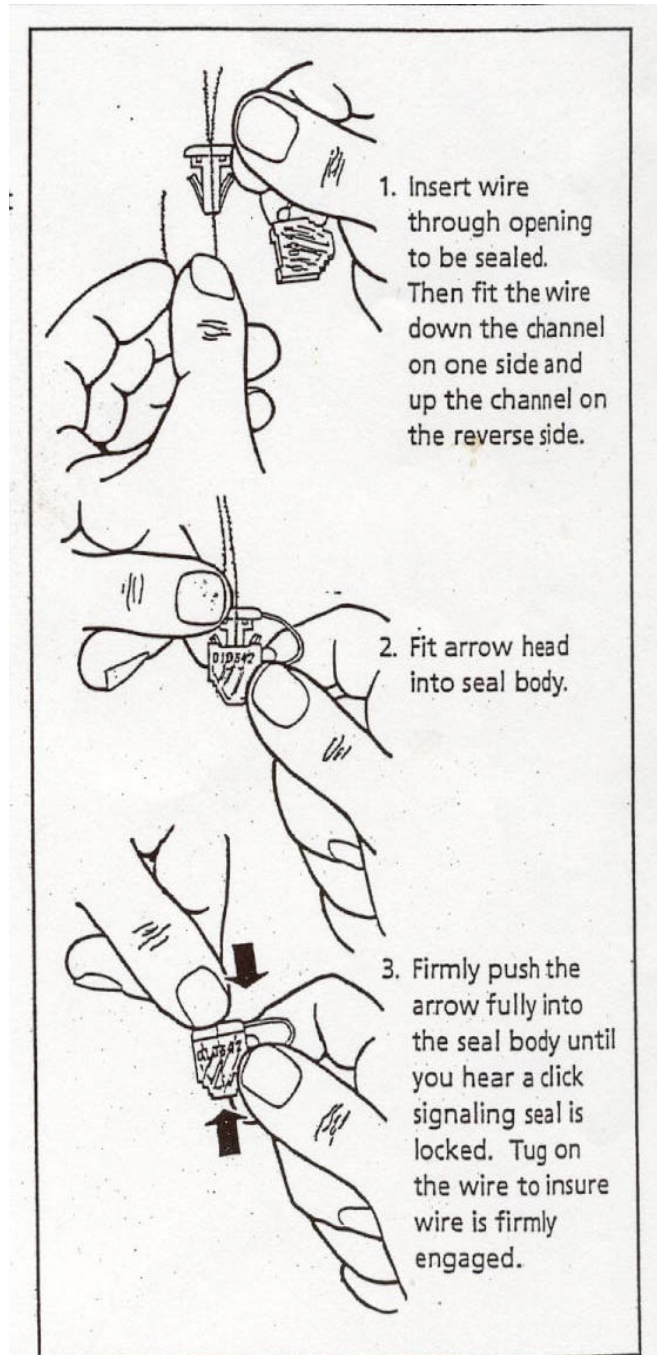


Since 1994, the number of methamphetamine (meth) labs in Kansas has exploded. Anhydrous ammonia is a primary component required to produce meth. Due to the dangers that farmers now face from the theft of anhydrous ammonia, a tamper tag program has been created.



The goal of this program is to increase farm safety by alerting producers when anhydrous tanks have been tampered with. Through the cooperation of agriculture producers in reporting thefts, our goal is to reduce the amount of illegal methamphetamine produced in Kansas.

Here's How the Tamper Tags Work



- Run wire of tag through liquid valve handle and around roll-over protection or the body of the valve.
- Tighten until the handle cannot be turned without removing the tag.
- To remove, simply cut the wire.

If you find a tank with a broken or missing tag call local law enforcement.
